A. Information

I. Goal of the funding

The establishment of the „CAS Research Groups“ at the Center for Advanced Studies is intended to strengthen the international networking of research projects at LMU Munich and increase their international visibility. For the first time, external scholars are also to be given the opportunity to apply for positions at the CAS in order to cooperate with scholars from the LMU.

As head of a CAS Research Group, outstanding scholars from LMU will be released from teaching duties for one year in order to concentrate entirely on their research project during this period. At the same time, this model is intended to assist in establishing a framework for an intensive form of international cooperation. Cooperation with international guest scholars must therefore constitute a fundamental element of the successful implementation of the research project in question. The research topic of the CAS Research Group will be advertised internationally following the completion of the application process, and the successful LMU scholar will then have the opportunity, in consultation with CAS, to put together the work group.

II. Extent of the funding

Heading a CAS Research Group includes the possibility to reduce teaching duties either partially or entirely for the applicant. The Center for Advanced Studies will also cover the cost of teaching hours lost for the participating international scholars. In addition, office space will be provided for the applicant as well as for the guest scholars.

Since the inclusion of internationally renowned scholars is of central importance for the implementation of the research projects, the visits by participating guest scholars should span a large portion of the time period allotted to the project. Funding for longer-term visits of guest scholars (a maximum of 24 fellow-months in total) is thus available.

Furthermore, material expenses of up to 25,000 Euro per CAS Research Group will be provided for the holding of workshops or conferences. Further possible uses for these funds include the employment of assistants, the financing of any necessary conference or research trips, or the subsidizing of printing costs for publications planned as part of the research project.

III. Application eligibility

All professors permanently employed at the LMU as well as tenure track professors are eligible to apply.



IV. Application deadline

Applications can be submitted to the Director of the Center for Advanced Studies no later than **31 March 2019** (postmark date).

V. Selection process

The decision on the granting of up to two positions as head of a CAS Research Group will be made by the Board of the Center for Advanced Studies on the basis of external assessments.

VI. Selection criteria

- identifiable excellence which can be furthered by the grant
- originality and innovativeness of the research topic
- foreseeable impulses for internationalization
- feasibility of the research project

VII. Duration

The duration period of a CAS Research Group is two semesters, beginning on 1 October 2020 and ending on September 30, 2021.

3. **Research Plan** (five to seven pages)

The description of the content of the research project to be realized should particularly outline the way in which it would benefit from cooperation with international colleagues. A description should also be provided as to how the guest scholars are to be integrated into the project, including the naming of potential candidates. Please outline in a general project plan which research goals are envisaged for each of the participants.

The duration of the research period for the applicant is two semesters; the visits of the participating guest scholars should last between one and twelve months. A total of 24 fellow-months are available.



4. Research Expenses

Please indicate the projected expenses for the holding of events (guest lectures, workshops, conferences) or the implementation of other plans. The maximum level of funding is 25,000 Euro. Please use the following table:

5. Reduction of Teaching Duties

The reduction of teaching duties will be granted by the President of the LMU based on the recommendation of the Center for Advanced Studies. In order to compensate for the loss of teaching hours, personnel costs for a full or partial replacement position (W3/W2) will be provided.
